LETTER DATED 29 OCTOBER 1991 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 717 (1991) of 16 October 1991 by which the Council decided to establish a United Nations Advance Mission in Cambodia (UNAMIC) immediately after the signing of the agreements for a comprehensive political settlement of the Cambodia conflict. As you are aware, these agreements were signed in Paris on 23 October 1991.

Having completed the necessary consultations, I propose that the military elements of UNAMIC be composed of contingents from the following Member States, all of whom have expressed their readiness in principle to make the necessary personnel available: Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Canada, China, France, Germany, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Malaysia, New Zealand, Pakistan, Poland, Senegal, Tunisia, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America and Uruguay. I am awaiting a reply from one other Member State which has been informally approached and will revert to the Security Council when I have an indication of whether it also is ready in principle to contribute military personnel to this Mission.

I should be grateful if you would bring these matters to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
