STATUS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 2666 (XXV) CONCERNING THE SIGNATURE AND RATIFICATION OF ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL II OF THE TREATY FOR THE PROHIBITION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS IN LATIN AMERICA (TREATY OF TLATELOLCO)

## Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. At its 1919th plenary meeting, on 7 December 1970, the General Assembly adopted resolution 2666 (XXV), which, <u>inter alia</u>, requested the Secretary-General to arrange for transmittal of the resolution to the nuclear-weapon States and to inform the General Assembly at its twenty-sixth session of any measure adopted by them in order to implement it.
- 2. In connexion with the above resolution, the General Assembly is seized of the following documents:
- (a) Letter dated 28 June 1971 from the Permanent Representative of the USSR to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General, containing a reply from the Supreme Soviet of the USSR to the Senate of the United Mexican States (A/8336/Rev.1); 1/
- (b) Letter dated 22 July 1971 from the Permanent Representative of Mexico to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General, containing a memorandum summarizing some basic facts concerning the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco) and Additional Protocol II thereof (A/8346).2/
