**PROTOCOL
ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS
BETWEEN GEORGIA AND SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES**

Georgia and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, later referred as parties, guided by mutual willingness to develop relations of friendship and cooperation between the two countries in political, economic, cultural and other fields, have decided to establish diplomatic relations at the Ambassadorial level.

Parties are convinced that the establishment of diplomatic relations between Georgia and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines corresponds to the interests of the two states, is not directed against any other country and will facilitate the strengthening of international cooperation and universal peace.

Parties, guided by the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and other fundamental norms and principles of international law, have agreed to develop the relations between the two States on the basis of the principles of sovereign equality, co-operation and friendly relations among states, territorial integrity and inviolability of frontiers of sovereign states, non-interference in internal affairs of another state, self-determination.

Parties have agreed to base their diplomatic relations on the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations, signed on April 18th, 1961.

The protocol is in force upon the signature.

Done in New York on 22 June 2010, in Georgian and English languages, all texts being equally authentic.
