NOTE VERBALE DATED 5 SEPTEMBER 1980 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF BRAZIL TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to note PO 230 SOAF, of 2 July 1980, has the honour to inform him of the following:

Brazil continues to abide by Security Council resolutions 418 (77) and 473 (80) concerning the mandatory arms embargo against South Africa. On several occasions the Brazilian Government has expressed its determination to ensure that the provisions of the above-mentioned resolutions are carried out at the national level. In particular, note verbale No. 128, of 26 July 1980, communicates to the Secretary-General of the United Nations the adoption of the necessary internal legislative measures for strict compliance with resolution 418 (1977). The position of Brazil on the matter remains unchanged.

The Permanent Representative of Brazil requests that this communication be circulated as a document of the Security Council.
