SCHOLARSHIP OFFERS AND AWARDS

Bolivia

1. In a note verbale dated 15 October 1991, the Permanent Mission of Bolivia to the United Nations informed the Secretary-General that, according to the information supplied to the Mission by the Bolivian Universities' Executive Committee, the Universidad Autónoma Gabriel René Moreno of Santa Cruz de la Sierra had expressed its willingness to support General Assembly resolution 45/20. The Universidad Nacional Siglo XX de Llallagua, Potosí, would be prepared to offer two vocational training scholarships for inhabitants of Non-Self-Governing Territories in the fields of agriculture, nursing and communications sciences. These scholarships would consist of exemption from payment of enrolment fees, board and lodging.

New Zealand

2. In a note verbale dated 21 November 1991, the Permanent Representative of New Zealand to the United Nations informed the Secretary-General that during 1991 there were 24 students from Tokelau pursuing their studies in New Zealand on Official Development Assistance Programme study awards. The same number of students is expected to continue to benefit from such assistance in 1992.

Sudan

3. In a note verbale dated 25 October 1991, the Permanent Mission of the Sudan to the United Nations informed the Secretary-General that the Government of the Sudan had decided to offer one scholarship for one inhabitant of a Non-Self-Governing Territory to study in the Faculty of Science in the University of Khartoum for the year 1991/92.
