Statement on South Africa issued on 29 November 1991 by the European Community

The Community and its member States warmly welcome the announcement of a date for the start of the negotiations in the framework of the multi/all-party conference on a new constitution establishing a united, non-racial and democratic South Africa. The Convention on a Democratic South Africa could be a landmark in the process of reform taking place in the country.

They express their hope that these negotiations will be conducted in a spirit of reconciliation and compromise.

The Community and its member States are convinced that only a negotiated settlement will bring lasting peace and prosperity to South Africa, thus positively contributing to the general progress of the region.
