

Excellency,

We should be grateful if the enclosed Joint Communiqué, which we have signed on behalf of our respective Governments, could kindly be distributed to all Member States of the United Nations.



The Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and the Government of the Republic of Mauritius, guided by mutual desire to initiate and develop ties of friendship and cooperation between the two States in political, trade, economic, cultural, technical and in any other field on the basis of common agreement;

Have decided to establish diplomatic relations as of the date of the signing of this Joint Communiqué, on the basis of the Vienna Convention and Diplomatic Relations on 18 April 1961;


The relations between the two States will be based on the principle and norms of the Charter of the United Nations and International Law, particularly, equality among States, respect for their independence, national sovereignty, territorial integrity and non interference in the internal affairs of the States;

The Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and the Government of the Republic of Mauritius are convinced that the establishment of diplomatic relations between them corresponds to the interests of the two States and contributes to the consolidation of the cooperation among them and of peace in the world;

In witness therefore, as a testimony of this act, the undersigned Representatives, duly authorized by the respective Government, have signed this Joint Communiqué.
