Excellency,


We have the honour to inform Your Excellency that as of today, the Governments of the Republic of Cameroon and Ireland have established diplomatic relations

Please accept, Excellency, the assurances of our highest consideration.



**Establishment of Diplomatic Relations
between Ireland and the Republic of Cameroon**


The Government of Ireland and the Government of Republic of Cameroon, guided by a shared willingness to develop ties of friendship and cooperation in the political, economic, cultural, humanitarian and other fields, have decided to establish diplomatic relations.

The Government of Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Cameroon, represented by their respective Permanent Representatives to the United Nations in New York, hereby agree to the establishment of diplomatic relations between their two countries as of the date of this Note based on the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of 18 April 1961 and on the principles and norms of the Charter of the United Nations and of international law.

The Government of Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Cameroon are fully convinced that the establishment of diplomatic relations corresponds to the interests of both States and will further strengthen international peace and security.

Signed in New York on 23 April 2007, in two originals, in the French and English languages, both texts being equally authentic.



entre la République du Cameroun et l'Irlande**




