CONSIDERATION OF THE DRAFT ARTICLES ON MOST-FAVOURED-NATION CLAUSES

Report of the Sixth Committee

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The item entitled "Consideration of the draft articles on most-favoured-nation clauses" was included in the provisional agenda of the forty-sixth session of the General Assembly, pursuant to paragraph (c) of decision 43/429 of 9 December 1988.
2. On the recommendation of the General Committee, the General Assembly decided at its 3rd plenary meeting, on 20 September 1991, to include the item in the agenda of its forty-sixth session and to allocate it to the Sixth Committee.
3. The Sixth Committee considered this item at its 4th meeting, on 26 September. The summary record of that meeting is contained in document A/C.6/46/SR.4.
4. The Chairman held intensive consultations with delegations on this item with a view to elaborating an appropriate draft decision.

II. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT DECISION PRESENTED BY THE CHAIRMAN

5. At the 16th meeting, on 18 October, the Chairman of the Sixth Committee introduced a draft decision (A/C.6/46/L.3) proposed by him.
6. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted the draft decision without a vote (see para. 7).

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE SIXTH COMMITTEE

7. The Sixth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

Consideration of the draft articles on
most-favoured-nation clauses

The General Assembly,

Noting with appreciation the valuable work done by the International Law Commission on the most-favoured-nation clauses, as well as the observations and comments of Member States, of organs of the United Nations, of the specialized agencies and of interested intergovernmental organizations,

Decides to bring the draft articles on most-favoured-nation clauses contained in the report of the International Law Commission 1/ to the attention of Member States and of interested intergovernmental organizations for their consideration in such cases and to such extent as they deem appropriate.
