Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 51st meeting, on 13 December 1991, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/46/62) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/46/L.30. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions presented the Committee's report orally.

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

2. The Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/46/L.30, an additional appropriation of \$163,300 would be required under section 2 (Good offices and peace-making; peace-keeping; research and the collection of information) of the programme budget for the biennium 1992-1993. In accordance with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 41/213 of 19 December 1986, these additional requirements should be provided without recourse to the contingency fund. In addition, an additional appropriation of \$35,000 would be required under section 36 (Staff assessment), offset by the same amount under income section 1 (Income from staff assessment).
