Letter dated 28 April 1987 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 13 April 1987 (A/42/221-S/18801), I have the honour to report to you the following serious incidents in violation of Pakistan's territory and airspace from the Afghanistan side that occurred on 23, 24 and 25 April 1987:

On 23 April 1987:

(a) At 0940 hours (Pakistan standard time), the Afghan armed forces fired 18 rounds of artillery, which landed in the area Shilman of Khyber Agency. As a result, one person was injured;

(b) Between 1350 hours and 1710 hours (Pakistan standard time), the Afghan armed forces fired 51 rounds of artillerv, which landed in the area Ghakhai of Bajaur Agency. As a result, two civilians (Pakistan nationals) were injured.

On 24 April 1987 at 1000 hours (Pakistan standard time), six Afghan fighter aircraft penetrated Pakistan's airspace by 5 kilometres, dropped six bombs and fired 30 rockets in the area Ghakhai of Bajaur Agency. As a result, two personnel of Bajaur Scouts were injured.

On 25 April 1987 at 0825 hours (Pakistan standard time) six Afghan fighter aircraft violated Pakistan's airspace and dropped 12 hombs and rockets in the area of Nawa Pass in the Mohmand Agency. As a result, one member of the Frontier Corps was injured.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office at Islamabad on 28 April 1987 and a strong protest was lodged with him over these unprovoked attacks. He was asked to inform his authorities that, if such attacks did not cease, the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on the Kabul authorities.

I request to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items 31, 73, 131, 136 and 140 of the preliminary list, and of the Security Council.
