ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

Letter dated 8 April 1987 from the Permanent Representatives of Argentina, Bahamas, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Equatorial Guinea, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Spain, United States of America, Uruguay and Venezuela addressed to the Secretary-General

On 12 October 1982, the representatives of the countries signing this letter requested that the agenda of the thirty-seventh regular session of the General Assembly should include an additional item entitled "Observance of the quincentenary of the discovery of America".

We were prompted to do so by the conviction that 1492 was a date of great historical significance which helped to bring the Indo-American and European cultures into contact, thus opening up new horizons for the universality that is a feature of international society today and is reaffirmed in the Charter of the United Nations.

The five centuries separating us from that date are filled with deeds of all kinds done by our peoples as a result of this historic and fruitful contact, in order to establish their national identities and reaffirm their cultures.

Although the item has been withdrawn from the agenda of the current session of the General Assembly for administrative and budgetary reasons, we wish to state that the spirit behind our initiative in 1982 is still alive and that we feel that the United Nations, through the General Assembly, cannot remain uninvolved in 1992

in the observance of an event that was such a decisive factor in broadening the perspectives of the course of history in our times and in integrating different cultural spheres and establishing communication between them.
