IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION OF THE INDIAN OCEAN AS A ZONE OF PEACE

Appointment of a member of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Indian Ocean

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. In paragraph 1 of resolution 34/80 B of 11 December 1979, the General Assembly decided to enlarge the Ad Hoc Committee on the Indian Ocean by the addition of new members to be appointed by the President of the Assembly on the recommendation of the Committee.
- 2. By a communication dated 6 May 1987, the President of the General Assembly informed the Secretary-General that, on the basis of the recommendation made by the Ad Hoc Committee at its 312th meeting, on 2 April 1987, and in accordance with the established practice, he had appointed Zimbabwe as an additional member of the Committee.
- 3. As a result of the above appointment, the Ad Hoc Committee on the Indian Ocean is composed of the following 49 Member States:
