- 1. In the statement submitted by the Secretary-General in document A/SPC/46/L.10 on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/SPC/46/L.9, it was indicated that should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution, additional appropriations of \$269,900 would be required (\$11,900 under section 1 and \$258,000 under section 2 of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1992-1993). In addition, an amount of \$38,300 would be required under section 36. Staff assessment, to be offset by the same amount under income section 1. Income from staff assessment.
- 2. Following further review, the Secretary-General now considers that, should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution, the staff requirements for the tasks called for in the draft resolution could be met from the overall resources available to the Office for Special Political Affairs. No additional requirements for salaries and common staff costs would thus arise under the regular budget. As to related estimated requirements for travel of staff and the association and maintenance of office astomation optops at, it would be the intention of the Secretary-General to seek voluntary contributions to cover the cost of these items.
