1. Page 6: replace the eighth preambular paragraph by the following text

<u>Gravely concerned</u> that certain countries, transnational corporations and international financial institutions have continued their economic relations with South Africa,

2. Page 6: replace the ninth preambular paragraph by the following text

Recognizing the crucial and decisive role the imposition of international sanctions has played in applying the necessary pressure on the South African regime to undertake significant measures towards the eradication of apartheid,

3. Page 7: delete old paragraph 6

- 4. Page 7: replace former paragraph 7 by the following text (new paragraph 6)
 - 6. Strongly condemns the collaboration with the South African regime by certain countries as well as transnational corporations that continue to make new investments in South Africa and supply the racist regime with armaments, nuclear technology and all other materials that are likely to buttress it and thus aggravate the threat to world peace;
- 5. Page 7: insert a new paragraph 7 reading
 - 7. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to maintain the existing measures against the apartheid regime as specified in the Declaration on Apartheid and its Destructive Consequences in Southern Africa;
- 6. Page 7: delete former paragraph 8 and renumber subsequent paragraphs accordingly
- 7. Page 8: replace former paragraph 16 by the following text (new paragraph 15)
 - 15. Appeals to mass media, trade unions and non-governmental organizations, as well as individuals, to continue their efforts in the struggle against apartheid and the mobilization of international public opinion against the policy pursued by the South African apartheid regime and to oppose the relaxation of existing measures against the regime, in order to accelerate the process of constitutional change;
