NOTE VERBALE DATED 22 JANUARY 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE OF BRAZIL TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General and, with reference to his note dated 16 December 1991, has the honour to state that the Government of Brazil strictly abides by the provisions of Security Council resolution 713 (1991), which calls for a general and complete embargo on all deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Yugoslavia.

In this connection, please find enclosed the text of Presidential Decree No. 411, enacted on 3 January 1992 by President Fernando Collor and published in the Official Register on 6 January, whereby the Brazilian authorities are obliged to ensure compliance with the provisions of Security Council resolution 731 (1991).

Presidential Decree No. 411 enacted by the President of the
Federative Republic of Brazil on 3 January 1992 concerning
the implementation, within the national territory, of
Security Council resolution 713 (1991)

The President of the Republic, by the powers invested in him by article 84 (IV) of the Constitution and in accordance with Article 25 of the United Nations Charter, proclaimed by Presidential Decree No. 19,841 of 22 October 1946, hereby decrees that:

Article 1: The Brazilian authorities shall be obliged to comply, in respect of their several competences, with the provisions of resolution 713 (1991), particularly its paragraph 6, adopted by the United Nations Security Council on 25 September 1991, the text of which is attached herewith, which determines a general and complete embargo on all deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Yugoslavia.

Article 2: The present decree shall enter into effect on the date of publication.

Done in Brasilia, on the third day of January nineteen hundred and ninety-two.
