Convinced that the Security Council resolution 733 will be helpful in settling the Somali disputes peacefully, I assure you that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea will implement faithfully the related Security Council resolution in the future, too.

I avail myself of this opportunity to wish you successes in your responsible work for the international peace and security.
