NOTE VERBALE DATED 5 FEBRUARY 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT
REPRESENTATIVE OF HUNGARY TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Hungary to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to the note dated 28 January 1992 of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, has the honour to convey the following information regarding the measures undertaken by the Government of the Republic of Hungary to implement Security Council resolution 733 (1992) and, in particular, to meet the obligations stipulated in its paragraph 5 concerning a general and complete embargo on all deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Somalia.

National legislation in force in the Republic of Hungary specifically prohibits any sale or delivery of weapons and military equipment from the Republic of Hungary to countries where armed conflicts take place, or such conflicts may be expected to occur or to countries regarding which the Security Council of the United Nations has called upon the parties to settle their dispute by peaceful means of negotiations, or to countries regarding which the Security Council has decided on an arms embargo (government decree 48/1991).

Violations of the relevant legal provisions are punishable to the full extent of the law.

It follows from the foregoing that the Government of the Republic of Hungary strictly abides by Security Council resolution 733 (1992), under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, on the immediate implementation of a general and complete embargo on all deliveries on weapons and military equipment to Somalia.
