

NOTE VERBALE DATED 4 FEBRUARY 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CHINA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the People's Republic of China to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and, with reference to the latter's Note SCPC/2/92(1) dated 28 January 1992, has the honour to inform the Secretary-General of the Chinese Government's implementation of provisions in paragraphs 5, 6 and 9 of Security Council resolution 733 (1992):

- 1. In view of the domestic situation in Somalia in recent years, the Chinese Government officially issued a circular on 3 January 1991, stiputating that all the Chinese departments concerned and arms trade companies must stop, from the date of issuance of the circular, delivering to Somalia any kind of military equipments and spare parts. Up to date, the Chinese departments concerned have strictly abided by the Chinese Government's stipulations:
- 2. The Chinese Government has strictly observed the provisions in paragraph 6;
- 3. Due to such reasons as turbulent situation in Somalia and since security is not quaranteed, the Chinese Government has not yet started its humanitarian assistance to Somalia.
