ADMISSION OF NEW MEMBERS

LETTER DATED 19 FEBRUARY 1992 FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND POLITICAL AFFAIRS OF THE REPUBLIC OF SAN MARINO ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL (S/23619)

The PRESIDENT: The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

In a letter dated 19 February 1992 addressed to the Secretary-General, the Secretary of State for Foreign and Political Affairs of the Republic of San Marino submitted the application of his country for membership in the United Nations. That letter has been circulated in document S/23619.

Under the provisions of rule 59 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, unless the Council decides otherwise, an application for membership shall be referred by the President of the Council to the Committee on the Admission of New Members. Accordingly, unless I hear a proposal to the contrary, I shall refer the application of the Republic of San Marino to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for examination and report.

As I hear no objection, it is so decided.

I would propose that the Committee on the Admission of New Members schedule a meeting at 10.30 a.m. on Monday, 24 February, in Conference Room 7, to consider the application of the Republic of San Marino for membership in the United Nations.

The meeting rose at 6.45 p.m.
