(k) APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

1. The CHAIRMAN drew attention to document A/46/234/Add.1, whereby the General Assembly had been informed of the resignation of Mr. Dryukov (Russian Federation) as a member of the International Civil Service Commission and the need to appoint someone to fill the unexpired portion of his term of office, which was due to expire on 31 December 1993. It had further been informed (para. 2) that the Government of the Russian Federation had nominated Mr. Keniyaykin to fill the vacancy.
2. He had been informed that, before putting forward the candidacy, the Secretary-General had carried out the consultations called for in article 4, paragraph 1, of the statute of the International Civil Service Commission.
3. Since there was only one candidate for the vacancy, he would take it, if he heard no objection, that the Committee wished to dispense with the secret ballot and to recommend by acclamation the appointment of Mr. Keniyaykin (Russian Federation) to the International Civil Service Commission to fill the unexpired portion of Mr. Dryukov's term of office.
4. It was so decided.
5. After drawing attention to article 5, paragraph 3, of the Statute of the International Civil Service Commission, which provided that "a member of the Commission may resign on giving three months' notice to the Secretary-General", he suggested that the Committee should recommend to the General Assembly that it waive the requirement of three months' notice in order to permit the resignation of Mr. Dryukov and the appointment of Mr. Keniyaykin to take effect immediately.
6. It was so decided.
