**Letter dated 18 March 1992 from the Minister
for Foreign Affairs of Afghanistan addressed

APPENDIX

Statement dated 18 March 1992 by the President of Afghanistan

I have just concluded an intensive round of consultations with Mr. Benon Sevan, the Personal Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General in Afghanistan and Pakistan, concerning the Secretary-General's efforts to promote a political settlement of the Afghan question. I have given Mr. Sevan the assurances of my Government's full support for the efforts of the Secretary-General, in particular the proposed Afghan gathering.

Furthermore, I have again assured Mr. Sevan, on the basis of the proposal of His Excellency Boutros-Ghali, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the commitment I have made to the people of Afghanistan, that I will not insist on my personal participation in the proposed Afghan gathering hosted by the Secretary-General as part of the United Nations peace process.

I agree that once an understanding is reached through the United Nations process for the establishment of an interim government in Kabul, all powers and all executive authority will be transferred to the interim government as of the first day of the transition period. As stated by the Secretary-General, the interim government should have the appropriate powers and authority that should guarantee the unity, safety and security of the Afghan people, as well as the territorial integrity of Afghanistan. The interim government should also guarantee full respect for human rights, and organize and conduct free and fair elections for the establishment of an elected government of Afghanistan.

I fully agree with the Secretary-General, as stated in his report to the General Assembly at its forty-sixth session, and once again reiterated through Mr. Benon Sevan, that appropriate international guarantees should be provided in order to enable the interim government to carry out its tasks effectively.

I therefore reiterate my readiness to place the interests of the Afghan people above all personal interests, and it is my fervent hope that all other sides concerned will do likewise.
