## Nessage from the President of the Sixth Islamic Summit Conference addressed to the Secretary-General

As you are aware, the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina is a growing cause of concern, in spite of the many and varied efforts which have already been made to restore peace in that sensitive area.

The most recent developments in the crisis point to a worsening of the problem.

This is a real factor threatening international peace and security, which is causing increasing concern to the international community and especially to the countries members of the Organization of the Islamic Conference.

I should therefore be grateful, in my capacity as current Chairman of the Organization of the Islamic Conference, if you would take all appropriate measures in the context of the Security Council in order to maintain peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina, in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Charter of the United Nations.
