AMENDMENT TO DECREE ON THE IMPORT, EXPORT AND TRANSIT OF SUBSTANCES AS REFERRED TO IN SECTION 2 OF THE OPIUM ACT

24 May 1983, No. 206235

Having regard to section 5 of the Opium Act /Staatsblad (Bulletin of Acts,
Orders and Decrees) 1976, 425/; 1/

Decrees:

Article 1:

Article 3, paragraph 3 of the Decree on the import, export and transit of substances as referred to in section 2 of the Opium Act (Netherlands Government Gazette 1976, 204) shall read:

"An import certificate shall only be issued for a substance if and in so far as there is a medical or scientific need for that substance".

Article 2:

This decree shall enter into force as of the second day after publication of the Netherlands Government Gazette in which it appears.
