LETTER DATED 1 MAY 1992 FROM THE CHARGE D'AFFAIRES A.I. OF THE
PERMANENT MISSION OF ROMANIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO
THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

In connection with the implementation by Romania of Security Council resolution 748 (1992), I have the honour to inform you of the following.

In keeping with the obligations of Member States under the Charter of the United Nations, Romania fully implements the provisions of Security Council resolution 748 (1992).

In a statement made on 8 April 1992, the spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs reaffirmed the position of the Government of Romania, which strongly condemns all forms and acts of international terrorism, considering as it does that every State has a duty to assist unreservedly in elucidating cases of international terrorism and in establishing responsibility in each case.

On that same occasion, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs stated that "the Government of Romania, consistent with the principles of its foreign policy and its stand on the problem of terrorism, will respect the obligations incumbent upon it under the Charter of the United Nations and will comply with the provisions of Security Council resolution 748 (1992) despite the adverse consequences of the embargo for the Romanian economy".

Flights to the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya operated by the airline TAROM were discontinued on 29 March 1992. Thus, when the measures provided for in the resolution came into effect, air links between the two countries were no longer in existence.

In addition, the supply of military materiel to the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya was halted in 1991. Since that time no new contracts have been concluded with the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya in the military sphere, nor are any contracts currently being carried out.
