NOTE VERBALE DATED 15 MAY 1997 FROM THE PERMAMENT REPRESENTATIVE OF POLAND TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Poland to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and pursuant to Security Council resolution 748 (1992), paragraph 8, has the honour to submit the following report of the Government of the Republic of Poland on measures it has instituted for meeting the obligations contained in paragraphs 3 to 7 of the resolution:

"In implementation of the mandatory sanctions against the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, established by the Security Council in its resolution 748 (1992), the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Poland has adopted a resolution, effective as of 15 April 1992, obligating the Government branches concerned to proceed forthwith with the implementation of the relevant provisions of Security Council resolution 748 (1992).

Accordingly, as of 15 April 1992,

- no aircraft has been permitted to take off from. land in or overfly Polish territory if it was destined to land in or it took off from the territory of Libya. In effect all Polish air corridors have remained closed for all aircraft en route to or from Libya;
- no aircraft or aircraft components have been supplied to Libya, no engineering and maintenance servicing of Libyan aircraft or aircraft components has been provided, no certificates of air-worthiness for Libyan aircraft and no direct insurance for Libyan aircraft have been issued;
- government branches and agencies have been obligated under the Council of Ministers resolution to issue specific regulations banning the provision to Libya of arms and weapons and other military equipment and denying the provision of technical advice or training related thereto;

- in the period covered by this report no Polish officials or agents were present in Libya to advise the Libyan authorities on military matters;
- the staff at the Libyan diplomatic mission in Warsaw has been reduced from 19 to 17 and the movement of the remaining staff has been under control of competent authorities. All departures, beyond the radius of 50 km of Warsaw, must be notified in advance to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the final destination, means of transportation and the accompanying persons, if any, must be reported;
- proper steps have been taken to prevent the operation of the Libyan Airlines office in Warsaw;
- appropriate measures have been taken by the competent Polish authorities to deny entry to Libyan nationals who have been denied entry to or expelled from other States because of their involvement in terrorist activities.

Under previously adopted regulations. Libya is in a group of countries to which all military exports and the delivery of related services is prohibited."
