ANNEX

Telegram from the Vice-President of the Presidency of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia addressed to the Secretary-General

In our previous letter, we informed you of our efforts to do whatever we can with a view to ending the tragic war in Bosnia-Herzegovina. Today, I would like to inform you that the Serbian leadership in Bosnia-Herzegovina made the following proposal: firstly, that the Sarajevo Airport and the relevant air corridors be immediately demilitarized and placed under the control and protection of the United Nations and, secondly, that the whole city of Sarajevo be placed under the trusteeship of the United Nations. They today publicly announced this proposal in the International Press Centre in Belgrade.

Since this is a concrete proposal conducive to defusing the greatest and the most tragic trouble spot of the civil war in Bosnia-Herzegovina, which should be implemented in the shortest time possible, the Presidency of Yugoslavia feels that the relevant decision in this regard needs to be made.

I avail myself of this opportunity to inform you that a second big convoy with humanitarian relief and food sent by the Republic of Serbia yesterday successfully reached Sarajevo.
