# Note verbale dated 22 June 1992 from the Permanent Observer of Switzerland to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Observer of Switzerland to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General and, with reference to paragraph 12 of Security Council resolution 757 (1992), has the honour to inform him as follows.

Switzerland, as a country which is not a member of the United Nations, has taken the following measures:

# Paragraphs 4-7 of the resolution

On 2 June 1992 the Federal Council adopted the Ordinance instituting economic measures against Yuguslavia.\* The Ordinance entered into force on 3 June 1992.

# Paragraph 8 (a) of the resolution

On 12 June 1992 the Federal Department of Poreign Affairs ordered the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia" (Serbia and Montenegro) to reduce by four, by 3 July 1992, the diplomatic and consular staff of its Embassy at Børne and its Consulate General at Zurich.

### Paragraphs 8 (b) and (c) of the resolution

On 22 June 1992 the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs instructed the authorities and bodies competent with respect to culture and sports in Switzerland to cancel the exchanges and official contacts under way under their responsibility and to suspend examination of any new project in the same spheres.

With respect to scientific and technical cooperation no particular measures were called for in view of the absence of such cooperation on the bilateral level between Switzerland and the "Federal Republic of Yugoslavia" (Serbia and Montenegro).
