Statement by the Permanent Representative of Venezuela at the Consultations of the Security Council on 17 May 1991

Our country finds this statement by the President useful and timely, inspired as it is by a concern to anticipate and prevent circumstances that would be totally unacceptains to the Security Council.

Full compliance with resolution 687 (1991) is incumbent on Iraq, just as its supervision and enforcement are incumbent on this Council.

We are fully aware that the process of demarcation of the Iraq-Kuwait boundary is being carried out, as the President's statement points out, in the special circumstances following Iraq's invasion of Kuwait, which imperilled international peace and security, and that there is therefore no question of a precedent being set that would alter the general principle expressed in Article 33 of the Charter of the United Nations that the parties directly involved in a dispute of the kind we are discussing today should be the ones to negotiate and reach an appropriate agreement to overcome their differences.
