NOTE VERBALE DATED 22 JUNE 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF SINGAPORE TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Singapore to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to inform him that the Republic of Singapore has taken the necessary administrative measures to enforce sanctions against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegra), in compliance with and as provided for in Security Council resolution 757 (1992) of 30 May 1992.

In this respect, the Republic of Singapore has issued the following prohibitive orders and directives pursuant to Security Council resolution 757 (1992):

- (a) Prohibition of Imports and Exports Order (Yugoslavia Serbia and Montenegro) Order 1992;
 - (b) Marine circular to shipowners No. 8 of 1992;
- (c) Monetary authority of Singapore circular No. BFIG 7/92 to all banks in Singapore;
- (d) Monetary Authority of Singapore circular No. BFIG 8/92 to all financial institutions in Singapore.

The Republic of Singapore has also taken measures:

- (a) To deny permission for flights to or from the Federa Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbla and Montenegro) to land or overfly Singapore airspace;
- (b) To advise government/government-linked companies involved in the sale, supply and servicing of aircraft or aircraft components to comply with paragraph 7 (b) of the resolution;
- (c) To instruct government ministries/agencies to comply with paragraphs 8 (b) and 8 (c) of the resolution concerning sporting contacts,

scientific and technical cooperation, cultural exchanges and visits involving persons or groups officially sponsored by or representing the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro).

The Permanent Representative wishes to inform the Secretary-General that the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) does not have any diplomatic missions or consular posts in Singapore.

The sanctions will remain in force until the Security Council decides otherwise.
