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NOTE VERBALE DATED 23 JUNE 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF POLAND TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of the Republic of Poland to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and pursuant to Security Council resolution 757 (1992), paragraph 12, has the honour to submit the following report of the Government of the Republic of Poland on measures it has instituted for meeting the obligations contained in paragraphs 4 to 9 of the resolution.

In implementation of the mandatory sanctions against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), established by the Security Council in its resolution 757 (1992), the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Poland has adopted resolution No. 59/92, of 2 June 1992, on the implementation of Security Council resolution 757 (1992).

Accordingly, as of 22 June 1992:

- 1. The ban has been imposed on import into Poland of all commodities and products originating in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia as well as on export from Poland to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia of commodities and products originating in Poland, with the exception of supplies intended strictly for medical purposes and foodstuffs notified to the Committee established pursuant to resolution 724 (1991). According to the information of the Ministry of Foreign Economic Relations the transfer of goods to and from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia has ceased.
- 2. In order to implement the measures included in paragraph 5 of resolution 757 (1992) the Ministry of Finance has directed the Polish National Bank not to make available any funds deposited in the Republic of Poland to any authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. It is a prohibition of transfers to the authorities in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia or to any commercial, industrial or public utility, of any funds or any other financial or economic resources, except payments exclusively for strictly medical or humanitarian purposes and foodstuffs.

- 3. Pursuant to paragraph 7 of resolution 757 (1992) the Ministry of Transport and Maritime Economy has denied permission to any aircraft flying from or to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and for any aircraft registered in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. It has also prohibited the issue of any certificates of airworthiness for such aircraft and aircraft engines.
- 4. Implementing paragraph 8 (a) of resolution 757 (1992), the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has demanded from the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to reduce the level of its staff by two diplomats. The reduction has taken place.
- 5. Implementing paragraph 8 (b) of resolution 757 (1992), the Office of Physical Culture and Tourism has banned any participation in sporting events on the territory of Poland of persons or groups representing the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia.
- 6. Implementing paragraph 8 (c) of resolution 757 (1992), the Ministry of National Education, the Ministry of Culture and Arts and the State Committee for Scientific Research have suspended scientific and technical cooperation and cultural exchanges and visits involving persons or groups officially sponsored by the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia or representing it.
- All the foregoing actions constitute measures which have been undertaken by Poland to implement Security Council resolution 757 (1992).
