LETTER DATED 22 JUNE 1992 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF CANADA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
SECRETARY-GENERAL

With reference to United Nations Security Council resolution 757 (1992), paragraph 12 of which requests all States to report to the Secretary-General by 22 June 1992 on measures instituted to meet obligations under that resolution, I have the honour to advise that on 3 June 1992, the Canadian Government issued a set of regulations that encompass all measures of an economic and commercial nature included in resolution 757 (1992).

The Canadian Government has also informed all appropriate authorities in Canada of the obligation to sever all sports, cultural and scientific exchanges with persons representing the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), and will take all necessary steps to ensure implementation of this sanction. Moreover, the Canadian Government announced on 24 May 1992 a series of unilateral sanctions against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia including the closing of two Consulates of Yugoslavia in Canada and the suspension of JAT Airlines landing rights in Canada, two measures which were eventually included in the United Nations sanctions list.

In addition to its direct participation in United Nations efforts to bring peace to the regions of former Yugoslavia, Canada fully encourages and supports further United Nations actions and endeavours to ensure respect of the measures included in Security Council resolution 757 (1992).
