STATEMENT BY THE HEADS OF STATE OF THE BALTIC COUNTRIES

In Connection With the Appeal by
the President of Moldova

In a letter dated 20 June 1992, the President of the Republic of Moldova, Mr. Mircea Snegur draws attention to the dangerously extending conflict in Moldova and the new victims. The presence of the Russian Federation's 14th army and its interference in the internal affairs of another sovereign State destabilizes the situation in a threatening way.

The Undersigned Heads of State feel that the CSCE member States, in view of such developments, cannot remain bystanders, and call on them to use every available means to persuade the partners in this conflict to achieve a political regulation of the problem.
