SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH
THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN
THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/18570 of 8 January 1987.

During the week ending 17 October 1987, at its 2753rd meeting, held on 15 October 1987, the Security Council gave consideration to the letter dated 21 August 1987 from the Acting President and Minister for External Affairs of the Republic of Nauru addressed to the Secretary-General, concerning Nauru's application submitted pursuant to Article 93, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations, to become a party to the Statute of the International Court of Justice (S/19137). Upon the proposal of the President of the Council, the Council decided that, in conformity with existing precedents, the application submitted by the Republic of Nauru, which was contained in document S/19137, would be referred to the Council's Committee of Experts for study. The President further proposed that, as it was most desirable that the Council, and then the General Assembly, take a decision on that application before the close of the Assembly's current forty-second session, the Committee of Experts would meet on the following day, 16 October 1987, to examine the application of the Republic of Nauru and that Committee would prepare its report for consideration by the Council at a Council meeting scheduled for Monday, 19 October 1987. There being no objection, it was so decided.

During that week ending 17 October 1987, the Security Council took no action on any of the items listed in document S/18570.
