BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR DISPLACED PERSONS IN THE FRENCH ZONE OF
OCCUPATION

INFORMATION SUPPLIED BY THE FRENCH DELEGATION

4. Estimates for the administrative personnel of centres of displaced persons.

The supervision of displaced persons as a whole is undertaken by the personnel of the Military Government already on the spot. The administration and management of the 25 centres kept in being, requires a maximum of 25 chief officials, 25 assistants and 25 office assistants, or 75 persons in all. Additional staff might be recruited from among the displaced persons themselves.

2. The budget estimates for 1947 are calculated on an average monthly figure of 51,000 displaced persons. Those on rations have received from the French authorities for the six months, January to June, the following in Reichsmarks (per month).

3. The cost price mentioned may be decreased for the following reasons:

- (a) As food supplies will in future come from within the zone, German prices are less than French prices.
 - (b) The food ration has been reduced from 3,300 to 1,580 calories, with effect as from 1 July 1946.
 - (c) As large scale repatriation has come to an end, very few repatriation convoys, food en route and heating of trucks in winter need be provided for.
 - (d) The major part of the work involved in the reconditioning of the centres has been finished.
 - (e) Able-bodied displaced persons will all be set to work.
