SECRETARY-GENERAL'S BULLETIN NO. 71

To: Members of the Staff of United Nations

Subject: REPATRIATION

1. Purpose

This bylletin establishes policy with respect to repatriation of staff members on termination of service with the United Nations.

2. Folicy

A staff member shall be entitled, subject to the provisions of SGB/7 and addenda and SGB/11/Rev.1, to payment of the costs of repatriation provided that:

(a) he was recruited in his home country and assigned to duty in another;

 (b) he was employed at the time of recruitment in a country other than his home country immediately prior to his appointment to United
Nations by an organization which was committed to repatriating him.
Proof of such commitment will be required;

(c) he was in the country where he was recruited under a temporary visa, such as student or tourist;

(d) he left his home country in the period 1939 to 1945 inclusive for reasons consequent upon the war and entered the country where he was recruited under an immigration quota but can present convincing evidence that he would have returned to his home country except for his entering the service of United Nations.
