

SECRETARY-GENERAL'S BULLETIN NO. 70

To: Members of the Staff of United Nations

Subject: TEMPORARY EXPATRIATION ALLOWANCE

1. Purpose

This bulletin establishes a temporary expatriation allowance for United Nations staff members, whose normal place of residence before joining United Nations was outside the country in which their permanent official duty station is located and will apply at all United Nations Offices. The purpose of this allowance is to compensate staff members for the disadvantages of living away from their home countries.

2. Amount of Allowance

The amount of allowance at Headquarters will be:

- (a) for staff members without dependents within the meaning of SGB/62 at the rate of \$250 per year;
- (b) for staff members with dependents within the meaning of SGB/62 at the rate of \$500 per year;

increased or decreased in accordance with the salary differentials which may be established from time to time for offices away from Headquarters.

3. Entitlement

This allowance will be paid only to those entitled to the two working weeks of home leave under SGB/67, except that this bulletin will not apply to those who receive a representation allowance.

4. Administration

The Bureau of Personnel will be responsible for determining entitlement to the allowance under the terms of this bulletin. Instructions on the filing of /claims will

claims will be issued separately. Payment will be made, on establishment of entitlement, by the Bureau of the Comptroller, and will be included in the staff member's fortnightly pay cheque.

5. Effective Date

Payment of the expatriation allowance to entitled staff members will begin as of 16 June 1947.
