CONVENTION ON THE DECLARATION OF DEATH OF MISSING PERSONS: ASSESSMENT OF THE EXPENSES OF THE INTERNATIONAL BUREAU FOR DECLARATIONS OF DEATH UPON SUCH NON-MEMBER STATES AS MAY BECOME PARTIES TO THE CONVENTION

Report by the Secretary-General

- 1. General Assembly resolution 493 (V) of 16 November 1950, provides that the expenses of the International Bureau for Declaration of Death should be assessed upon such non-member States as may become parties to the Convention, in accordance with the principle adopted in this respect in connexion with the expenses of the International Court of Justice.
- 2. Since so far no non-member State has become a party to the Convention, no action is required by the Committee at its present session. It is proposed that if any non-member States should become parties to the Convention during 1954 they should be assessed retroactively in respect of the 1954 expenses of the Bureau.
