

The Republic of Suriname and the Republic of the Sudan, guided by mutual willingness to develop fraternal ties of friendship and cooperation in de political, economic, humanitarian and other fields, have decided to establish diplomatic relations as of the date of the signing of this Joint Communiqué.


The two countries agreed to establish their diplomatic relations in accordance with the Vienna Convention of 18 April 1961 on Diplomatic Relations and relevant principles and norms of the United Nations Charter and International Law.

The Republic of Suriname and the Republic of the Sudan are fully convinced that the establishment of diplomatic relations corresponds to the interests of the two States and will further strengthen international peace and security.


