Joint Communique on the establishment of Diplomatic relations between the Republic of Macedonia and the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka

The Government of the Republic of Macedonia and the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, guided by mutual willingness to develop friendly relations and cooperation between the two States in political, trade, economic and other fields, have decided to establish diplomatic relations at Ambassadorial level with effect from the date of signature of the present Joint Communique.

The two countries have agreed to establish diplomatic relations based on the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of April 18, 1961 and principles and norms of the Charter of the United Nations and International Law.

The Republic of Macedonia and the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka are fully convinced that the establishment of diplomatic relations corresponds to the interests of both states and will further strengthen international peace and security.

In witness whereof, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed this Joint Communique in duplicate in Macedonian and English languages, all texts being equally authentic.
