The following letter dated 27 February 1975 from the Director of the Division of Budget and Finance of the International Atomic Energy Agency to the Deputy Controller of the United Nations is submitted to the Committee for consideration:

By letter of 28 January 1975 addressed to the Director General of the Agency, the Permanent Secretary of the Office of the Prime Minister of Grenada requested information with regard to the application of Grenada for membership in the International Atomic Energy Agency. In order to comply with this request, I am turning to you once again for assistance. Could you please inform me as to the possible scale of assessment which Grenada would be assessed in the United Nations, as well as the per capita national income for Grenada, in order to determine the calculation of the assessment, particularly with regard to the safeguards portion under the regular budget?

I thank you in advance for the continued assistance extended to the Agency in this regard.

The Agency was provided with the following data in a confidential reply dated 11 March 1975:

I refer to your letter of 27 February 1975 on the subject of the application of Grenada for membership in the International Atomic Energy Agency.

The theoretical probable percentage rate of assessment for Grenada is 0.02. Her per capita national income (based on the 1969-1971 average used in the formulation of the 1974-1976 scale of assessments) is \$273.

The theoretical probable percentage rate for Grenada being the minimum, it was felt that the Committee would have no objection to the release of the information requested. However, since no rate of assessment had been recommended by the Committee in connexion with Grenada's membership in the United Nations, the views of the Committee on the subject are sought for the guidance of its Secretary in responding to similar requests which may be received in the future.
