JOINT STATEMENT ON THE ESTABLISHMENTS OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS BETWEEN THE STATE OF QATAR AND THE REPUBLIC OF GUYANA

The Government of the state of Qatar and the Government of the Republic of Guyana, in line with their mutual desire to strengthen and develop friendship and cooperation between their two countries, decided to establish diplomatic relations at the ambassadorial level.

The two parties wish to express their confidence that the establishment of diplomatic relations and the exchange of ambassadors between the two countries will contribute to the development of international cooperation and the consolidation of world peace.

The two countries affirm their willingness to build their mutual relations in accordance with the United Nations Charter and on the basis of the principles of peaceful co-existence, equality and mutual respect of their sovereignty and territorial integrity and non-interference in the internal affairs of each other.

Done in New York City on 23rd of August, 1996, in two equally authentic texts in the Arabic and English languages, whereas all copies have equal force.
