Letter dated 7 August 1992 from the President of the Federal
Republic of Yugoslavia to the Secretary-General

With reference to unfounded allegations of the existence of concentration camps on the territory of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, I should like to propose the setting up of an international commission composed of prominent international figures, preferably former concentration camp inmates like, for example, Mr. Elie Wiesel, with the task of examining the plausibility of the claims that such "concentration camps" are in existence in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. My country is willing to extend every possible support and assistance to such a commission.

I would be grateful to you, Mr. Secretary-General, if you could personally establish such a commission.
