Excellency,

We have the honour to inform you that, on December 11, 1979 the Governments of Fiji and Jamaica simultaneously published a joint communique regarding the establishment of diplomatic relations. The text read as follows:

"The Government of Fiji and the Government of Jamaica desirous of promoting a spirit of mutual understanding and of developing ties of friendship and cooperation between their respective countries and peoples, have agreed to establish formal diplomatic relations, at the ambassadorial level, with effect from December 11, 1979.

Both Governments have expressed their confidence that this agreement will contribute to the development of mutually beneficial trade, economic, cultural and other ties between their two countries in the interest of strengthening peace and international co-operation and of promoting the principles of international law in relations among States".
