1. Substances of Class 4.3, 3°:

These substances appear in transport category 0 and include UN Nos. 1928 and 3207. UN No. 3207, however, may concern Packing Groups I, II or III.

As regards Packing Group III (= transport category 3), there is a double rule for UN No. 3207, since in transport category 3, unlike transport categories 1 and 2, there is no exception in respect of transport category 0.

2. Substances of Class 6.2, 3°:

These substances are also quoted in transport category 2, although they are assigned to group (b) (Packing Group II) and because of the introductory sentence fall into transport category 2 (see also Class 6.2, 4°).

3. Substances of UN Nos. 0081, 0092, 0084, 0241, 0331, 0332, 0482, 1005 and 2007:

For these substances, which appear in transport categories 1 and 2 respectively, the permissible maximum quantity per wagon/transport unit, in accordance with footnote (b)/ $\underline{1}$ /, amounts to 50 [kg].

No account is taken of this in the "sum" of the second subparagraph/paragraph 3 (the multiplying factor for these substances should logically be 20 and not 50, and 3, respectively).
