SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

## Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/13737 of 11 January 1980.

During the week ending 21 June 1980, the Security Council took action on the following item:

At its 2232nd meeting, held on 17 June 1980, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the item, having before it the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon, covering the period from 11 December 1979 to 12 June 1980 (S/13994).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Ireland, Israel, Lebanon and the Netherlands, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President called attention to a draft resolution (S/14001) which had been prepared in the course of consultations among the members of the Council.

The Security Council adopted the draft resolution (S/14001) as resolution 474 (1980) by a vote of 14 votes to none. One member (China) did not participate in the voting.

Resolution 474 (1980) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolutions 425 (1978), 426 (1978), 427 (1978), 434 (1978), 444 (1979), 450 (1979), 459 (1979) and 467 (1980), as well as the statement by the President of the Security Council of 18 April 1980 (5/13900),

Having studied the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) of 12 June 1980 (S/13994),

Acting in response to the request of the Government of Lebanon and noting with concern the questions raised in its letters addressed to the Security Council on 8 May 1980 (S/13931), 17 May 1980 (S/13946) and 27 May 1980 (S/13962),

Convinced that the present situation has serious consequences for peace and security in the Middle East,

Reaffirming its call for the strict respect for the territorial integrity, unity, sovereignty and political independence of Lebanon within its internationally recognized boundaries,

Commending the performance of UNIFIL yet expressing its concern about the continued existence of obstacles against the full deployment of the Force, its freedom of movement, the threats to its security and the safety of its headquarters,

- 1. Decides to renew the mandate of the Force for six months, that is, until 19 December 1980, and reiterates its commitment to the full implementation of the mandate of UNIFIL throughout its entire area of operations up to the internationally recognized boundaries, according to the terms of reference and guidelines as stated and confirmed in the appropriate Security Council resolutions;
- 2. Takes note of the Secretary-General's report (S/13994) and fully endorses the conclusions and recommendations expressed therein;
- 3. Strongly condemns all actions contrary to the provisions of the mandate and, in particular, continued acts of violence that prevent UNIFIL fulfilment of this mandate:

- 4. Takes note of the steps already taken by the Secretary-General to convene a meeting of the Israel-Lebanon Mixed Armistice Commission (ILMAC), and urges the parties concerned to extend to him their full co-operation in accordance with the relevant Security Council decisions and resolutions, including resolution 467 (1980);
- 5. Takes note of the efforts deployed by the Member States, and more particularly the troop-contributing countries, in support of UNIFIL, and urges all those which are in a position to do so to continue to use their influence with those concerned, so that the Force can discharge its responsibilities fully and unhampered;
- 6. Reaffirms its determination, in the event of continuing obstruction of the mandate of UNIFIL, to examine practical ways and means to secure the full implementation of resolution 425 (1978);
  - 7. Decides to remain seized of the question.
