ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The agenda was adopted.

APPLICATION OF THE REPUBLIC OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA FOR ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED NATIONS

The CHAIRMAN said that, at the 3078th meeting of the Security Council, held on 20 May 1992, the President of the Security Council had decided to refer to the Committee the application of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina for admission to membership in the United Nations, contained in a letter dated 8 May 1992 from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina addressed to the Secretary-General (S/23971), for examination and report to the Council.

The Secretariat had prepared a draft report, which had been distributed to the members of the Committee. Since the application of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina for admission to membership in the United Nations had been submitted while the forty-sixth session of the General Assembly was suspended, the Committee in its draft report recommended that the Council should apply the last paragraph of rule 60 of its provisional rules of procedure.

If he heard no objection, he would take it that the Committee wished to adopt the draft report to the Security Council.

It was so decided.
