NOTE VERBALE DATED 24 FEBRUARY 1999 FROM THE PERMANENT
MISSION OF SPAIN TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE

The Permanent Mission of Spain to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Chairman of the Security Council Committee established by resolution 864 (1993) concerning the situation in Angola and, with reference to his note verbale dated 27 January 1999, has the honour to recall that in a note verbale dated 13 August 1998 the Government of Spain submitted its reply concerning the legislative provisions required to implement the measures imposed on UNITA pursuant to the relevant resolutions of the Security Council.

The Permanent Mission of Spain to the United Nations wishes to reiterate the contents of the aforementioned note verbale and has the honour to report that the Government of Spain has taken the necessary steps to implement the provisions of Security Council resolutions 1173 (1998) and 1176 (1998) on the basis of the common position adopted by the European Union on 3 July 1998 and regulation 1705/98 adopted by the Council of the European Union on 28 July 1998, which all States members of the European Union are obligated to implement and which is directly applicable in Spain.
