## Draft decision

Provisional agenda for the twelfth session of the High-level Committee on the Review of Technical Cooperation among

Developing Countries

The High-level Committee,

Taking into account the views expressed at its eleventh session,

- 1.  $\underline{\text{Approves}}$  the following provisional agenda for its twelfth session, to be held in 2001:
  - 1. Opening of the session.
  - 2. Review of progress made in implementing the Buenos Aires Plan of Action and the decisions of the High-level Committee.
  - 3. Progress made in the implementation of the new directions strategy for technical cooperation among developing countries.
  - 4. Consideration of reports of the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme:
    - (a) Implementation of the guidelines for the review of policies and procedures by the United Nations development system concerning technical cooperation among developing countries;
    - (b) Organizational and supportive arrangements for technical cooperation among developing countries (such as administrative, legal, informational and financial arrangements).

- 5. Thematic discussion (including presentation of country experiences) on the theme: "South/South technology transfer for global integration and sustainable development".
- 6. Adoption of the report of the Working Group.
- 7. Approval of the provisional agenda for the thirteenth session of the High-level Committee.
- 8. Other matters.
- 9. Adoption of the report of the High-level Committee on its twelfth session.
- 2. <u>Requests</u> its Bureau, in cooperation with the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, to adjust the provisional agenda for the twelfth session, as approved at the eleventh session, taking fully into account the results of the eleventh session, as well as developments relevant to technical cooperation among developing countries throughout the world, including at the United Nations and other important international forums.
