Annual Report covering the period from 24 April 1998 to 6 May 1999

INTRODUCTION

1. The present Annual Report was adopted unanimously by the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) at the sixth meeting of its fifty-fourth session on 6 May 1999.

CHAPTER I

ISSUES CALLING FOR ACTION BY THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL OR BROUGHT TO ITS ATTENTION

CHAPTER II

WORK OF THE COMMISSION SINCE ITS FIFTY-THIRD SESSION

A. Activities of subsidiary bodies

3. A list of meetings held since the fifty-third session is contained in Annex I, showing in each case the dates, the officers and the symbols of the report. These reports record the agreements reached and decisions taken.

B. Other activities

4. The secretariat serviced the regular session of the Commission, meetings of its subsidiary bodies, and other meetings held under its auspices. A list of the reports submitted to the fifty-fourth session of the Commission is given in Annex II. Periodic reviews, including the Economic Survey of Europe, and a series of specialized statistical bulletins, were published. The secretariat maintained close and regular liaison with United Nations Headquarters and cooperated with the Departments concerned, as well as with the secretariats of the other regional commissions on projects of common interest.

C. Relations with other United Nations Programmes

5. The cooperation of the Commission and its secretariat in 1998/1999 with various United Nations bodies and other international organizations, as well as with their secretariats, is described in document E/ECE/1370.

CHAPTER III

FIFTY-FOURTH SESSION OF THE COMMISSION

A. Attendance and organization of work

- 6. The fifty-fourth session of the Commission was held from 4 to 6 May 1999. The Commission heard statements by the Chairman and the Executive Secretary.
- 7. The fifty-fourth session was attended by representatives from Albania, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Russian Federation, San Marino, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Tajikistan, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and United States of America.
- 8. The session was attended by representatives of the European Community.
- 9. Representatives of the Holy See participated under article 8 of the Commission's terms of reference.
- 10. Representatives of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) and the following intergovernmental organizations were in attendance: International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), World Trade Organization (WTO), Council of Europe.
- 11. For discussion of the ECE cooperation with subregional groupings and initiatives, representatives of the Black Sea Economic Cooperation (BSEC), Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), CIS Interstate Economic Committee and Southeast European Cooperative Initiative (SECI) were in attendance.
- 12. The following non-governmental organizations were represented: International Council of Women; International Federation of Business and Professional Women; World Federation of United Nations Associations; Zonta International.
- 13. A complete list of participants can be found in document E/ECE(54)/INF.1/Rev.1.

B. Agenda

- 14. The Commission adopted its agenda (E/ECE/1367/Rev.1) which read as follows:

C. Election of Officers

15. The Chairman of the fifty-fourth session of the Commission was Mr. Miroslav Somol (Czech Republic) and the Vice-Chairmen were Mr. Petros Eftychiou (Cyprus), Mr. Harald Kried (Austria) and Mr. Bolat Utemuratov (Kazakhstan).

- 16. Ms. Jacqueline Aquilina (Malta) was designated Rapporteur by the Bureau.
- 17. At its sixth meeting the Commission elected by acclamation Mr. Miroslav Somol (Czech Republic) Chairman of the fifty-fifth session. Mr. Harald Kried (Austria) was re-elected Vice-Chairman and Mr. Murat Sungar (Turkey) and Mr. Amiran Kavadze (Georgia) were elected Vice-Chairmen of the fifty-fifth session.

D. Account of proceedings

Strengthening cooperation within the ECE region

(Agenda item 2)

(a) Consequences of the financial crisis in the ECE region

- 18. As called for in the Plan of Action, the secretariat organized a debate on a major economic theme. This year the theme chosen was the consequences of the financial crisis on the ECE region. The seminar was divided into three sessions.
- (i) The impact of the global financial and economic crisis on the ECE region, with special emphasis on western and central Europe: (Session I) was chaired by Mr. Miroslav Somol (Ambassador of the Czech Republic to the United Nations Office at Geneva and Chairman of the Commission). Mr. Jorge Braga de Macedo (Professor, Nova University, Lisbon, former Minister of Finance, Portugal, and former EC Director General); Mr. Christian de Boissieu (Professor, La Sorbonne, Paris); Mr. Antonio Costa (Secretary General, EBRD); Mr. László Csaba (Budapest University of Economics and KOPINT-DATORG); and Mr. Daniel Gottlieb (Senior Adviser to the Governor of the Central Bank of Israel) acted as discussion leaders.
- (ii) Overcoming the crisis of the Russian economy: (Session II) was chaired by Mr. Antonio Costa (Secretary General, EBRD). Mr. Grzegorz Kolodko, (Professor at Warsaw School of Economics, Deputy Premier and Minister of Finance of Poland, 1994-97); Mr. Andrei Swinarenko (Deputy Minister of Economics of the Russian Federation); and Mr. Rumen Dobrinsky (Economic Affairs Officer, Economic Commission for Europe) acted as discussion leaders.
- (iii) (Session III) which concentrated on the threats to the transition process in other economies was chaired by Mr. Bernhard Molitor (Chairman, OECD Economic Development and Review Committee). Mr. Daniel Daianu (former Minister of Finance of Romania and President of the Romanian Institute for Free Enterprise); Mr. Lutz Hoffmann (President, DIW, Berlin); Mr. Igor Mitiukov (Minister of Finance of Ukraine); Mrs Brigita Schmögnerová (Minister of Finance, Slovakia); and Mr. Timo Summa (Director, Directorate-General IA, European Commission) acted as discussion leaders.

- 19. The Commission then reconverted to formal segment. The Executive Secretary made an introductory statement and presented Conference Room Paper No. 1 on "Recovery in Southeast Europe after a settlement of the conflict in Yugoslavia Elements for a contribution by the UN/ECE". Delegations recognized that ECE has expertise in a number of areas of relevance to the post-conflict reconstruction of Southeast Europe and that such expertise should be drawn upon wherever possible to assist in the coordinated economic reconstruction of the region. They also asked the secretariat to elaborate further on the proposals contained in the Conference Room paper, and on the additional ideas expressed by delegations, relating to all its areas of expertise. Delegations stressed that it was essential that activities be properly coordinated between all the organizations and institutions involved in the reconstruction effort.
- 20. There was a proposal made by a delegation that Skopje be designated as a regional centre for the coordination of the future activities for the reconstruction of the region.

Other suggestions and proposals were also made by delegations.

Since no suggestion or proposal was addressed by the Commission, the secretariat was later requested, in conformity with the Plan of Action (Chapter III B(b)) to summarize the discussion and circulate this summary to member States after consulting the Bureau.

(b) Operational activities and cooperation with regional/subregional groupings, initiatives and organizations

- 21. The Commission recognized the importance of ECE's operational activities and the contribution they made to economic integration and the strengthening of stability, peace and good neighbourly relations among countries in the region.
- 22. The Executive Secretary was invited to respond to requests for such assistance in a geographically balanced manner and to pay special attention to requests from those countries most in need of assistance.
- 23. In view of the limited resources available, the Executive Secretary and ECE member States were invited to explore possibilities for providing additional financing for the Commission's operational activities, in close cooperation with the relevant financial institutions and donor organizations, in support of various types of activities such as advisory missions, seminars, training workshops and for developing projects within the framework of sub-regional groupings and initiatives, in particular the Southeast European Cooperative Initiative (SECI), the Special Programme for the Economies of Central Asia (SPECA) and the Black Sea Economic Cooperation (BSEC). It was further recognized that ECE's efforts in the Mediterranean had very often failed because of lack of financial resources and, therefore, additional efforts should be made to mobilize resources with a view to responding to the specific

circumstances and needs of the Commission's Mediterranean countries. In this context, the Barcelona Process was mentioned as a dynamic framework for subregional economic cooperation.

- 24. The Commission expressed its appreciation of the effective cooperation and dialogue that had been established with regional/subregional organizations and initiatives, especially SECI, SPECA, BSEC and the Central European Initiative (CEI). It invited the Executive Secretary to continue to strengthen this cooperation, stressing that it be complementary to that provided by other institutions and organizations and that information on projects supported by ECE within the framework of subregional groupings and initiatives be shared in order to maximize synergies among them. The need to plan sufficiently such cooperation well in advance was also stressed.
- 25. It was recognized that the Regional Advisers continue to play an important role in advising and helping the countries in transition to apply ECE norms, standards and conventions. The Commission expressed its concern that the resources had diminished for funding and staffing for the regional advisory programme and that the activities of the Regional Advisers had been considerably reduced between 1998 and 1999. The Executive Secretary invited ECE member States to take the necessary steps within the framework of the relevant United Nations intergovernmental bodies to ensure that ECE was allocated the necessary resources in the biennium 2000-2001.
- 26. In order to maximize the impact of the Commission's technical assistance and provide further guidance, each PSB was requested to look at the operational activities undertaken within its field of competence and mandate and to identify the needs for operational activities and financing for them. The Commission requested that a synthesis of the conclusions of each PSB's review be prepared for consideration at its fifty-fifth session.

(a) Issues related to the work of the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work

- 27. The Commission had before it the report of the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work (E/ECE/1372) on the prioritization process. The Commission expressed its appreciation of the work of the Group of Experts, the secretariat and the PSBs in this exercise. It endorsed the new system of prioritization of PSBs' work programmes proposed by the Group of Experts as well as the related recommendations that:
- All PSB activities using ECE regular budget resources should be included in the prioritization exercise;
- The three-tier system of prioritization should be maintained, but PSBs which account for less than 5% of total ECE resources (Human Settlements, Timber and Sustainable Energy) may, if necessary, prioritize their activities on a two-tier basis;

- A proforma should be produced for individual PSBs to complete during the prioritization exercise;
- An explanatory note should be produced to accompany the new proforma; and
- The Chairman or a representative of the GEPW should attend the annual meetings between the Bureau of the Commission and the PSB Bureaux. Other informal meetings between the PSBs and the Group of Experts could be arranged as necessary.

(b) Exchange of views on cross-sectoral concerns including intersectoral linkages

- 28. The Commission reviewed the progress made in the integration of the two cross-sectoral concerns, namely sustainable development and gender mainstreaming, into the work programme of ECE, based on the secretariat's paper (E/ECE/1369). While noting the unevenness in the progress made across the different sectors, the Commission recognized that integration of cross-sectoral issues was a long-term process which could only be achieved through continued action and effort. In this regard, the chairpersons of Principal Subsidiary Bodies expressed their commitment to support the process.
- 29. In relation to sustainable development, recognizing it as a subject that cut across all areas of activity of ECE, the Commission:
- invited the Committee on Environmental Policy to review all activities related to sustainable development and make suggestions to each PSB and to the Commission on a more systematic approach at the ECE level.
- 30. In the area of gender mainstreaming, the Commission expressed its desire to see further efforts made in this regard. Also in relation to gender issues, the Commission:
- endorsed the convening of an expert meeting at the intergovernmental level, in response to the request by the General Assembly, which would review economic issues, problems and policies relating to the situation of women in ECE countries, in order to provide a regional assessment for the 2000 review of the implementation of the Beijing Platform for Action. Other issues would also be addressed according to the respective interests and work areas of other organizations to be involved in the preparation of this meeting. The details of the meeting would be finalized at the June ad hoc informal meeting of the Commission, based on a proposal prepared by the ECE secretariat in consultation with these organizations as well as member States.
- 31. The Commission also commended recent developments in intersectoral cooperation, in particular in the fields of transport and environment, as well as environment and health, and urged that further advances be made in this direction.

(c) Follow-up to the ECOSOC resolution relating to the regional commissions

32. The Commission took note with satisfaction of the document on follow-up to the ECOSOC resolution relating to the regional commissions (E/ECE/1370). It was agreed that it was not necessary for the Commission to transmit the document to ECOSOC since information contained therein would be included in the Secretary-General's report to ECOSOC on regional cooperation. The secretariat was invited to continue its efforts to enhance cooperation and dialogue along the lines outlined in the report by participating in management coordination mechanisms, including United Nations system regional Inter-Agency Meetings and the ACC, and by cooperating with United Nations entities, programmes and funds. The secretariat was also encouraged to keep ECE member States informed of developments.

(d) Cooperation with European institutions and Pan-European organizations and subregional organizations

- 33. The Commission considered ECE's cooperation with other European institutions, pan-European and subregional organizations, based on document E/ECE/1371.
- 34. It was agreed that ECE's cooperation with the institutions and organizations cited in the report was extremely important. The Commission urged ECE to continue to strengthen this cooperation, paying due regard to the comparative advantages of each organization and ensuring the most efficient use of resources.
- 35. Regarding the proposals contained in Conference Room Paper No. 2, "Europe, a Common Will Proposal for a pan-European process", the Executive Secretary was invited to take into account the comments made during the course of the debate and to continue his consultations, keeping ECE member States informed.

Matters arising from the work of subsidiary bodies requiring decision by the Commission

(Agenda item 4)

36. Under this item, the Commission endorsed the recommendation that the Meeting of Officials on Land Administration (MOLA) be granted a standing character, as proposed in document E/ECE/1373. This was on the basis of the Commission's recognition of the MOLA group's work in the promotion of land privatization and land registration systems in the ECE region and of the need for such work to continue, in particular for the benefit of countries with economies in transition that are moving from traditional to modern systems of land administration.

Proposed Programme Budget for 2000-2001

(Agenda item 5)

- 37. Under this item this item the Secretary of the Commission provided information on the ECE budget submission for the biennium 2000-200l. It was indicated that the total amount of resources allocated to/ ECE for 2000-2001 would be at the same level as for the biennium 1998-1999. The Commission was further informed that the published budget of the Secretary-General contained a request for an additional post of Information Officer in the Office of the Executive Secretary. Delegations were invited to support this proposal during the budget discussions at the General Assembly. Delegations were also called upon to ensure that the resources allocated to ECE under Section 21 of the budget be at least equivalent to or above those received during the current biennium.
- 38. The Commission was also informed that ECE's budget submission in the results-based format had been selected among the regional commissions to be used as a prototype for submission to the General Assembly. Following the interest expressed by member countries, it was agreed that information on the results-based budget exercise would be communicated to them through the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work.

Other business

(Agenda item 7)

- 39. The Chairman announced that the tentative dates for the holding of the fifty-fifth session of the Commission in Geneva were 2-5 May 2000, taking into account the need to avoid choosing dates which might conflict with those of other important meetings. No objections were raised.
- 40. There was a suggestion, not addressed by the Commission, that Tirana could be considered as a centre for coordination of the future activities for the reconstruction of Southeast Europe.
- 41. It was agreed that the question of biennialization of the Commission sessions would be reconsidered by the Group of Experts on the Programme of Work, as agreed by the Commission at its fifty-third session, and that the Group should report back to an ad hoc informal meeting of the Commission.

Adoption of the Annual Report of the Commission

(Agenda item 8)

42. At its sixth meeting, on 6 May 1999, the Commission adopted its report covering the period from 24 April 1998 to 6 May 1999.
